



- A digital collection of your academic work and experiences
- More than just a folder of assignments
- A tool to showcase your learning journey
- Completely controlled by, the student





CURRENT CHALLENGES

Common obstacles teachers tackle daily in their classrooms



LOW ENGAGEMENT

students often show signs of disengagement during whole group lessons or independent practice

DIVERSE CLASSES

class make-ups range from all levels of academic achievement



CONSTANT CHANGE

students at different levels coming from different teachers and no continuity from year to year



MAKING LEARNING VISIBLE

making improvements leading to greater academic achievement



INCREASED ENGAGEMENT

immediate feedback, increased motivation, interactive learning

SHOWCASING LEARNING

place to display content, experiences, and track progress for college and job search.



4 C's of Education

increase critical thinking, communication, collaboration, and creativity for future-ready learners







Education built around digital portfolios not only ties together various studentgenerated artifacts into a coherent whole but also creates an environment in which technology use has a clearly identified purpose (Donaldson, 2012)





- Collect artifacts like essays, projects, and artwork
- Document your academic and personal growth
- Create a unique narrative of your learning
- Reflect on how you've developed skills over time

Benefits

- Demonstrates your skills to future employers
- Helps you understand your own learning process
- Tracks your progress across different courses
- Shows learning beyond just grades





Challenges and Opportunities

- Requires time and effort
- Develops critical thinking skills
- Helps you understand your learning style
- Prepares you for future professional environments

- Start small and build gradually






